Below are the Yoga Video Movements.

The Breath

Connect one movement and one breath throughout the practice

Neck - Repeat Each Exercise 3x's

Neck stretch - look down, look up

Bridge of neck - move your ear toward the left shoulder, then to the right

Look left, look right

Bring your chin to the chest - rotate the chin from the left shoulder to the right

Spinal Flexion/Extension 3-6x's

Seated cat/cow

Cow - send the heart forward as the shoulder blades squeeze together

Cat - draw the navel in and round out through the shoulder blades

Shoulders - Repeat Each Exercise 3x's

Roll your shoulders up and back down Roll the shoulders back then forward

Arms

Inhale, stretch your arms overhead Open the arms to a tee shape Bend one arm at a time, bringing the hand to the heart, 6-8x's

With a smart phone hold your camera app open and hover it over the QR code. This will open the web video on your phone for you to click and start your yoga routine.







Chair Yoga Continued

Arms, continued

Inhale, bring your arms overhead Open the arms to a tee Twist from your core to the left Inhale, arms overhead Open the arms to a tee Twist from your core to the right

Spinal spiral

Make small belly circles left and right

Hips and Legs

Cross the left ankle over the right knee - keep the foot flexed to protect the knee

Lift the heart and hinge forward lightly to feel a stretch in the hip (piriformis)

Cross the right ankle over the left knee - keep the foot flexed to protect the knee

Lift the heart and hinge forward lightly to feel stretch in the hip (piriformis)

Feet and Ankles - Repeat Each Exercise 3x's

Start with feet planted firmly on the floor
Lift both heels with toes rooted to the ground
Lift the left foot, rotate the ankle left and right
Point and flex the left foot
Lift right foot, rotate ankle left and right
Point and flex the right foot

Stand Up Flying Breath 3x's

Inhale, bring your arms overhead Exhale, bring the hands back down

Here is Angie's story in her own words:

This Bittersweet Hot Fudge continues to be a favorite recipe with all the now adult children, their children, and great-grandchildren. Each taste is filled with a simpler time of love, security, and memories!

Angie's Favorite Bittersweet Hot Fudge Sauce

This sauce has many uses and is delicious served warm on top of your favorite ice cream or sweet pie. You could use it on cookies, cheesecake, brownies, or as a spread for a dessert sandwich (with peanut butter)!



Ingredients

6 tablespoons (level) butter or oleo (margarine)

2 cups sifted confectioners sugar

3/4 cup cocoa

1 cup evaporated milk

1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

The recipe makes 2 cups of sauce.

You can easily double the quantity if you need lots!



- Melt the butter or margarine in a large saucepan
- Add the sugar and cocoa and mix well
- Gradually add the milk and beat until it's smooth
- Bring to a boil over medium heat
- Cook and stir continuously for about 5 minutes, or until the sauce has thickened.
- Stir in the vanilla. If the sauce is too thick at this stage, add some more evaporated milk until the consistency is to your liking.

Serve and enjoy!







Supplies Needed:

- 1. Pencil

It is composed of a soft filling, such as ganache or buttercream, sandwiched between two delicate shells made from egg whites, ground almonds, sugar, often other flavorings, and food coloring.

The most popular macaroon flavors are: pistachio, green tea, vanilla, caramel, chocolate, espresso, and raspberry.

Colorful, pillowy, and delicately flavored, macaroons are one of the most popular cookies in the world.

The name 'Macaroon' comes from the Italian word maccarone which means 'paste.'

The main objective is to have fun and make lots of words.




9 LETTER WORD SQUARE

Who was St. Patrick?

St. Patrick is the Patron Saint of Ireland and he was born in the second half of the fourth century. It is thought that he spent his childhood in Scotland or Wales.

At around age 16, he was kidnapped and sold into slavery in Ireland where he spent time in and worked as a herdsman of sheep and pigs. During this time of his life, St. Patrick became increasingly religious.

He later escaped back to England and his family. While there he had a dream that the Irish were calling him to tell them about God. St. Patrick spent the next 12 years in a French Monastery training as a priest. He then returned to Ireland as a bishop with the Pope's blessing.

The next 20 years was spent traveling around Ireland, baptizing people and establishing monasteries, schools and churches as he went. He spent 20 years on his mission and organized the church in Ireland.

St. Patrick died on the 17th of March in the second half of the 5th century.

A good parade has marching bands, Irish dancers, and representations by lots of different organizations with children and adults alike marching. Floats that are adorned very creatively with all things Irish are a big part of all parades and the streets are lined with thousands of spectators.

Many people will wear a little piece of fresh shamrock on their lapel or a shamrock emblem to mark the day. After the parades the pubs in Ireland fill up and people have a drink to celebrate. This custom is often called "Drowning the Shamrock".



Our brains tend to read words when faced with them automatically. You have to bypass that and focus on the **box color only**. It's easier said than done!
